Bear Search and Rescue Foundation's Extraordinary Service to Humanity Award

During 2005-2006, *CTC* solidified its position as the premier developer and trainer of Military Working Dogs (MWDs) for the Department of Defense (DoD). *CTC* has developed and trained all three of the MWD initiatives for the DoD: the Combat Tracker Dog, Mine Detection Dog, and Specialized Search Dog (SSD). *CTC*-trained dogs have an outstanding performance record. At the U.S. Special Operations Command (USSCOM) Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear (CBRN) Conference in December 2005, George Heib, *CTC* Manager, CBRNE Force Protection, concluded his presentation of the SSD concept with a demonstration. A U.S. Army SSD team trained by *CTC* found a small explosive training aid within two minutes to the amazement of the assembly. In addition, a U.S. Army SSD team trained by *CTC* won the Bear Search and Rescue Foundation's Extraordinary Service to Humanity Award—the first time the award has been given to an active military canine team.

CTC's MWD program is also credited with saving lives.
