**“2020 Women on Boards” Recognizes Concurrent Technologies Corporation as a Winning Company for the Second Time**

**Johnstown, PA, April 11, 2017** – The national “2020 Women on Boards” campaign has recognized Concurrent Technologies Corporation (CTC) as a 2016 Winning Company. 2020 Women on Boards lists 704 Winning Companies, i.e. companies that include 20 percent women on their boards, in its [Gender Diversity Directory](#) database of 1745 Fortune 1000 companies. Now seven years into the 10-year campaign, the organization says the goal is within reach, as 19.7% of board seats in those companies are now held by women compared to 14.6 percent in 2011, the first year of reporting.
