Concurrent Technologies Corporation Continues to be One of the “Best Places to Work in PA”

2011’s Distinction Marks CTC’s Eleventh Straight Year on the List

Johnstown, PA, December 8, 2011 – Concurrent Technologies Corporation (CTC) has been named to the 2011 list of the Best Places to Work in PA. The program is a public/private partnership between Team Pennsylvania Foundation, the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development, the Pennsylvania State Council of the Society for Human Resource Management, and the *Central Penn Business Journal*. Employers are categorized based upon the total number of employees they have in the United States.

“CTC employees are a large part of the evaluation process,” said Kathy Jones, CTC’s Senior Director, Human Resources. “Surveys are completed anonymously by employees and are worth 75% of the total evaluation. The other 25% comes from the evaluation of CTC’s workplace policies, practices, philosophies, and systems. The ability of CTC to make the Best Places to Work in PA year after year shows that our employees are extremely satisfied with the work environment that we provide for them.”
